

This can be important for safety, to keep the group together, and to report mechanical problems and to entertain each other with sights and quips along the way.

The club uses Motorola RDU2020 radios, which can be purchased on-line. They usually cost between \$180 and \$200 dollars, but sometimes you can find a good deal on eBay or Amazon.com. Just search the web, and find the best deal you can from a reliable shipper.

Another option would be to use an RDU2020 compatible radio. Arthur found the source below for compatible BANTAM radios. If you order one of these radios, you need to tell them to program it the same as Arthur Green's.




